Introduction

Aligned with the principles outlined in the National Education Policy 2020, Savitribai Phule Pune University has embraced an interdisciplinary approach to education. The NEP emphasizes the integration of various disciplines, encouraging the incorporation of related subjects within law courses. Additionally, there is a strong emphasis on the inclusion of the regional language (Marathi) within the academic curriculum.

Continuous Internal Evaluation:

In accordance with the evolving educational landscape and the NEP's encouragement of multidisciplinary learning, the college has introduced a framework for continuous internal evaluation in the assessment process.

Internal Evaluation Components- (For 2017 Pattern)

The internal examination structure incorporates four components, each contributing to a total of 20 marks for every subject (except practical training subjects):

Assignment – 5 Marks

Report Writing - 5 Marks

Class Presentation - 5 Marks

Viva Voce - 5 Marks

Internal Evaluation Components- (For CBCS Pattern 2023)

The division of 30 marks for each Course, except for practical training and Generic Elective subjects for internal assessment shall be as under:

1	One Written Test	10 Marks
2	Viva-Voce	10 Marks
3	Experiential learning through Extension work, Field Visit, Case Study, Case Comment, Legislative Comment, Judgment Analysis, Judgement Writing, Client Counselling, Projects, Extempore Moot Court, Arbitration, Mediation, Seminar Papers, Legal Aid Training, Para-legal Volunteering, etc. to be assessed by the teacher/s concerned. The College may decide any one or more of the above or any other activities to be conducted for the purpose of assessment of the student	10 Marks

Flexible Assessment Methods:

Students' written submissions encompass a variety of formats, such as essay writing, project work, case commentaries, or any other assignment activity designated by the Subject Teacher. Meanwhile, class performance evaluation includes aspects like viva voce, presentations related to written submissions, punctuality, participation in discussions, seminar presentations, and engagement in class activities, where the use of the regional language (Marathi) for presentations is encouraged.

Term-wise Evaluation:

Evaluation of written submissions and class performance will occur in each term or semester before the University's written examination. This continuous evaluation approach aims to gauge students' progress comprehensively throughout their academic journey.

Record Maintenance:

To maintain transparency and facilitate University inspection, the College will meticulously preserve records related to written submissions and class performance for a minimum of two academic years, excluding the evaluation year.

Integration of CBCS Pattern and Examination Structure

In line with the UGC's guidelines, the courses are categorized as follows:

Core Courses

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (P.T. Papers)

Skill Enhancement Courses


Discipline Specific Elective Courses

Moreover, the examination pattern follows a 70:30 split, wherein the written examination constitutes 70 marks, conducted by SPPU, and the internal assessment holds 30 marks, administered by the College. This structure aims to blend comprehensive external evaluation with continuous internal assessment, ensuring a holistic assessment of students' academic performance.
