Resource Person: Advocate Shreedhar Parundekar

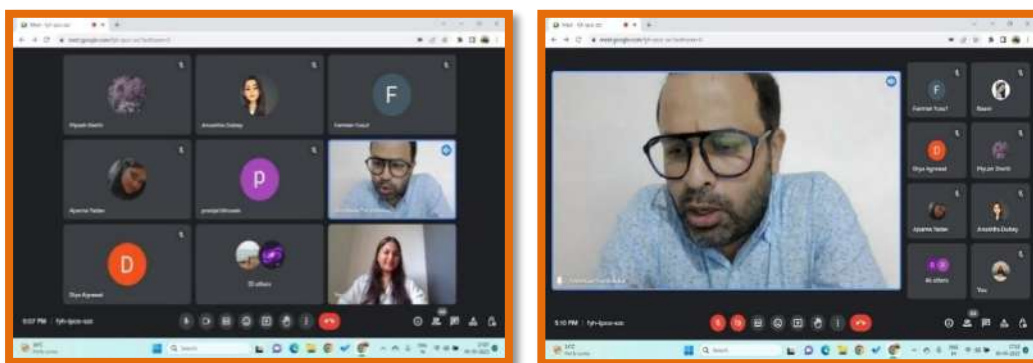

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5) A Session on ‘Architecture of Amending Power and Basic Structure Constitutionalism’

Topic: A Session on ‘Architecture of Amending Power and Basic Structure Constitutionalism’.

Resource Person: Dr. Sanjay Jain

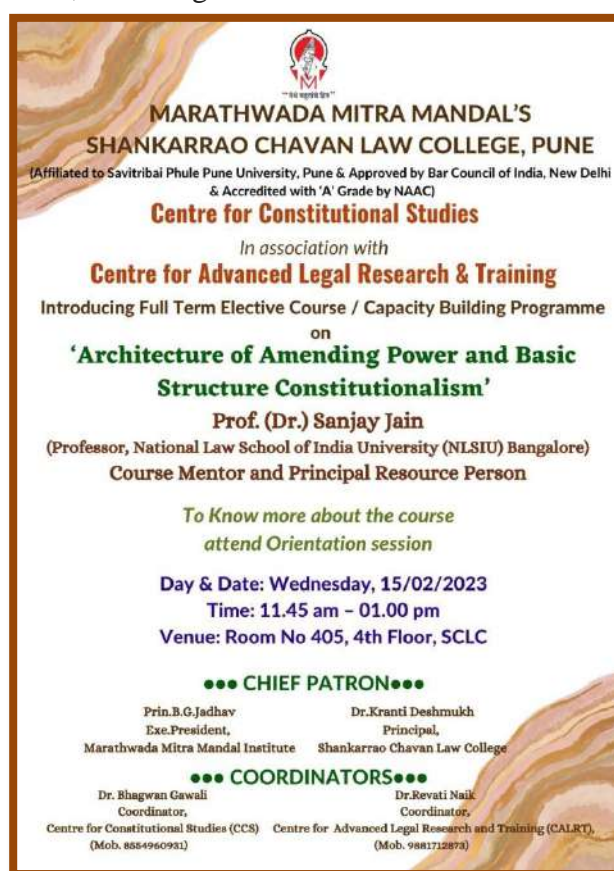
No. of Students Benefited: 37

Objective: For tackling questions related to constitutional amendments in judicial examinations and to provide law students with a comprehensive understanding of the architecture of amending power within constitutional frameworks, including its historical evolution.

Overview of the Event: The Centre for Advanced Legal Research and Training intends to introduce the course on ‘Architecture of Amending Power and Basic Structure Constitutionalism’. To discuss in detail course contents and the importance of the course, the orientation session was organized on 15th February, 2023. The orientation session was conducted by Dr. Sanjay Jain, Professor of National Law School of India University, Bengaluru. This report summarizes the key points discussed during the orientation session on "Architecture of Amending Power and Basic Structure Constitutionalism." The session aimed to

introduce participants to the intricacies of amending the constitution and the concept of basic structure in upholding its core principles.

The session began by exploring the constitutional provisions that grant the power to amend the Indian Constitution. This included an explanation of Articles 368, 369, and 372, which outline the process, limitations, and temporary provisions related to amendments. Prof (Dr.) Jain then elaborated on the different types of amendments. He described the amendment of fundamental rights and amendment of other provisions and the difference between the two. The session then



delved into the concept of "basic structure," a principle established by the Supreme Court in the landmark case of *Keshvananda Bharati v. State of Kerala* (1973). This doctrine states that while the Constitution can be amended, its basic structure, which forms the foundation of India's constitutional democracy, cannot be altered.

While speaking about the Significance of Amending Power and Basic Structure, sir emphasized the critical role of amending power in adapting the Constitution to evolving societal needs while maintaining its core principles. He said that the course designed by him covers the detail discussion about the various aspects relating to Basic Structure doctrine. The session provided a valuable introduction to the students of complex interplay between amending power and basic structure in ensuring the longevity and stability of the Indian Constitution.

The compering of the programme was done by Ms. Bhargavi Mundhe, student of B.A.LL.B. IV and formal vote of thanks was given by Ms. Suvidhi Jain student of B.A.LL.B. IV year.

Objectives: 1. To inform law graduates about the unique career opportunities available in the armed forces, particularly through participation in the Service Selection Board (SSB) tests, by providing insights into the selection process, eligibility criteria, and the role of legal expertise within the armed forces. 2. To equip attendees with practical strategies and preparation techniques specifically tailored to excel in the SSB tests, including mock interview sessions, guidance on written tests, and tips for enhancing communication skills and leadership qualities essential for success in the armed forces.

Overview of the Event: The speaker for today's session was Brig. Sunil Bodhe, a former Army Infantry Officer, currently working as a guide to students who aspire to join the Armed Forces and CAPF. The session started off with a brief introduction about the speaker by Ms. Tanya Swaraj, a student of BALLB 1st year, followed by the felicitation of the speaker by Dr. Manisha Shinde, HOD, and BALLB. The speaker commenced the lecture with a brief introduction about the Armed Forces and the various opportunities that it awaits.

The various topics covered in the lecture were:

1. The SSC- JAG Entrance Test for Law Graduates through which they can serve in the Armed Forces as a Judge Advocate General and its Intake Process.
2. The Combined Defence Service Exam (CDS); Various Academies that participate in it, and its eligibility criteria.
3. Women's Special Entry Scheme (Officers) and the Grant of Permanent Commission to Women Officers.
4. Various other opportunities for youth in the Armed Forces, namely: Assistant Commandant -Law, BSF, Coast Guard, CRPF, ITBP, Assam Rifles, NSG/SPG, CISF, SSB, IB, RAW, Greyhounds, Cobra Squad, Rashtriya Rifles, Etc.
5. Services Selection Board (SSB) Interview Techniques; enhancing the interview by working on the following elements: personality, human behaviour, ethics, morals & values, attitude, and aptitude.
6. SSB Selection Process and its three important players, namely: Candidate, Assessor, and the Selection System.



7. Officer Like Qualities (OLQs)

Throughout the session, he explained the points impeccably using various examples and constant interaction, hence leaving no scope for ambiguity in the minds of the students.

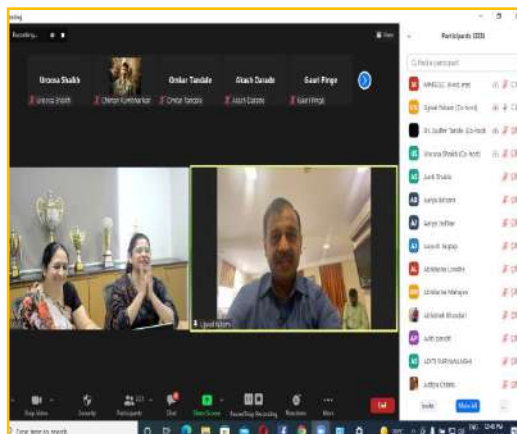
Marathwada MitraMandal's Shankarrao Chavan Law College, Pune has organized Induction
