# RECRUITMENT POLICY & PROCESS

## FOR RECRUITERS

The Training and Placement Cell at SCLC formed the rules as stated below to facilitate the recruitment process to ensure optimal flexibility to Recruiter/ Prospective Recruiters. The Recruitment Process can be seen as a step-by-step process as below:

### STEP ONE: PRE-PLACEMENT TALKS

- Placement Coordinators are encouraged to conduct Pre Placement Talks (PPT) for interested students in the College giving important information such as the profile of the organization, career prospects, compensation packages, etc.
- These PPTs can be conducted at any time before the Pre Interview Screening.

### STEP TWO: PRE-INTERVIEW SCREENING PROCESS

- The placement cell facilitates a seamless connection between potential employers and interested candidates by sharing their CVs. Subsequently, these CVs are reviewed by prospective employers who then select candidates to proceed with for in-person interviews.
- Recruiters are free to determine their own policy for the Screening Process to shortlist students.
- In case the Recruiter has no particular method of Pre Interview Screening, The Training & Placement Cell shall forward the Curriculum Vitae of all interested students who are screened & shortlisted by the Training & Placement Cell.

### STEP THREE: FINAL INTERVIEW

- The Recruiter shall formulate a Final Interview List subsequent to the completion of the Pre- Interview Screening Process and the same shall be communicated to the Cell at least 48 hours prior to the Interview along with the list of Waitlisted Candidates.

- In case any Applicant who is selected in the Final Interview List is not available for the interview then the Recruiter can interview the Waitlisted Candidate instead, if the Recruiter considers this appropriate.
- In case Recruiter has no procedure for Pre-Interview Screening, the list of interested student shall automatically become the Final Interview List.

#### **STEP FOUR: DISCLOSURE OF OFFERS**

- The Recruiters will be required to disclose the results of their Final Interviews and any offer made to Applicant (s) only through the Cell with confidentiality.
- The Recruiters will be requested to disclose a Wait-list along with the final offers. In the event of overlapping offers, the Recruiter may offer the Wait-listed candidates.
- Every offer made by the Recruiter will be communicated by the Cell to the Applicant to whom such offer was made.
- The Cell will revert to the Recruiter within due time provided by the Recruiter after receiving the communication containing the Selection List and the Wait-list.
- At no point of time during the recruitment process, there will be any direct communication between the Recruiter and the Applicant(s) in relation to the Offer.

#### **STEP FIVE: POST PLACEMENT COMMUNICATION**

- The Recruiter shall communicate the Training & Placement Cell any post placement issue which may arise immediately after the recruitment is completed.
- The Recruiter shall submit the employer's feedback as and when required for compliance purpose by the SCLC.
