1. Guest Lecture on 'Personality Development.'

Objective:

The guest lecture organized by the NSS unit of the college during its winter camp at Ambi village aimed to enlighten students on the importance of personality development in the legal profession. Overview of the event:

On 20th January, the NSS unit of the college hosted a guest lecture at Ambi village as part of its winter camp activities. The event featured Prof. Aditya Kedari, an esteemed resource person, who delivered an insightful talk on the role of personality in the legal profession. A large number of NSS volunteers attended the session, making it a highly interactive and impactful event.

Prof. Kedari began the lecture by dispelling the common misconception that personality is limited to physical appearance. He stressed that true personality encompasses inner traits such as confidence, communication skills, and emotional intelligence. contributes to building trust with clients, effectively arguing cases, and maintaining professionalism in and out of the courtroom.

Prof. Kedari emphasized the importance of cultivating habits like active listening, critical thinking, and empathy. He further encouraged students to engage in self-reflection, participate in extracurricular activities like moot courts and debates, and seek mentorship to refine their personal and professional attributes.

4. Personality, Ability and Psychometric Assessment of Students

Objective:

The activity titled '*Personality, Ability, and Psychometric Assessment of Students*' aimed to achieve several objectives through a structured approach. The primary goal was to evaluate the personality traits and abilities of first-year students to gain insights into their strengths, areas for improvement, and overall psychometric profiles. This understanding served as the foundation for creating a supportive and personalized mentorship system within the college.

By using the assessment results, students were allocated mentors who would guide them in overcoming challenges related to self-expression and confidence. The activity also focused on identifying and nurturing students' innate talents, which might otherwise remain unnoticed or underdeveloped. This process was integrated into the college's Induction Programme to ensure that students could seamlessly adapt to their new environment.

Through this initiative, the college aimed to facilitate the personal and academic growth of students, enabling them to thrive both in their educational journey and beyond.

Overview of the event:

A Psychometric Assessment of students was done during the Induction Programme, which is a student-enabling activity initiated by the College. A Mentor-Mentee programme is conducted by the College to bridge the gaps and help students become expressive, confident and shape their innate talents, which otherwise remain hidden or unattended. Based on the assessment, students are allocated mentors, who meet once in a semester as per the schedule communicated. Class-wise students were asked to appear for the test, which was moderated by Mr. Ankit More, a Psychologist from Illumination, Pune who was formally consulted by the College to systematically conduct the test.

Students were provided with a QR code and a link to complete the test. Faculty Coordinators of the Programme, Dr. Sourabh Ubale, Dr. Manisha Shinde and Mr. Chandramani Bhalerao made the necessary arrangements required to complete the test as per the classes allocated to them.

Objective:

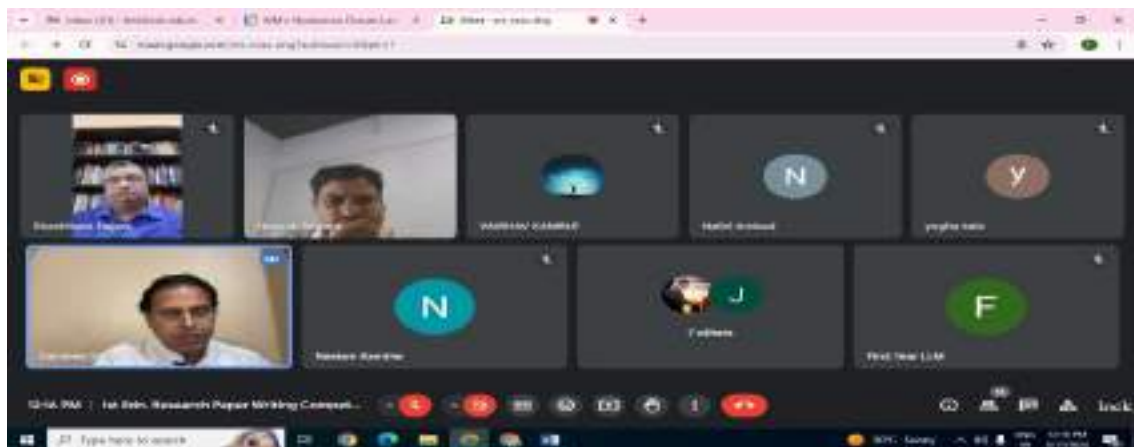
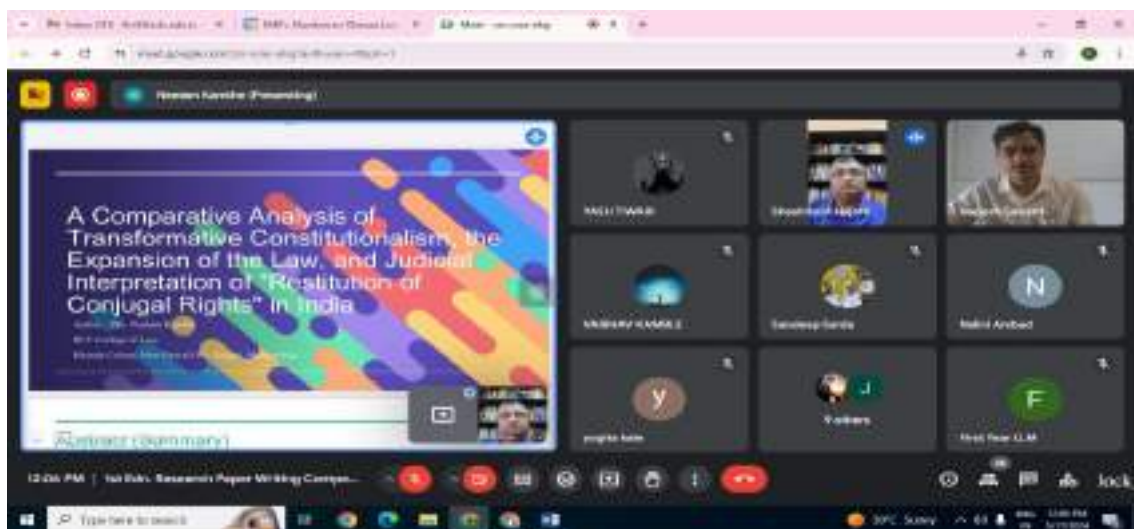
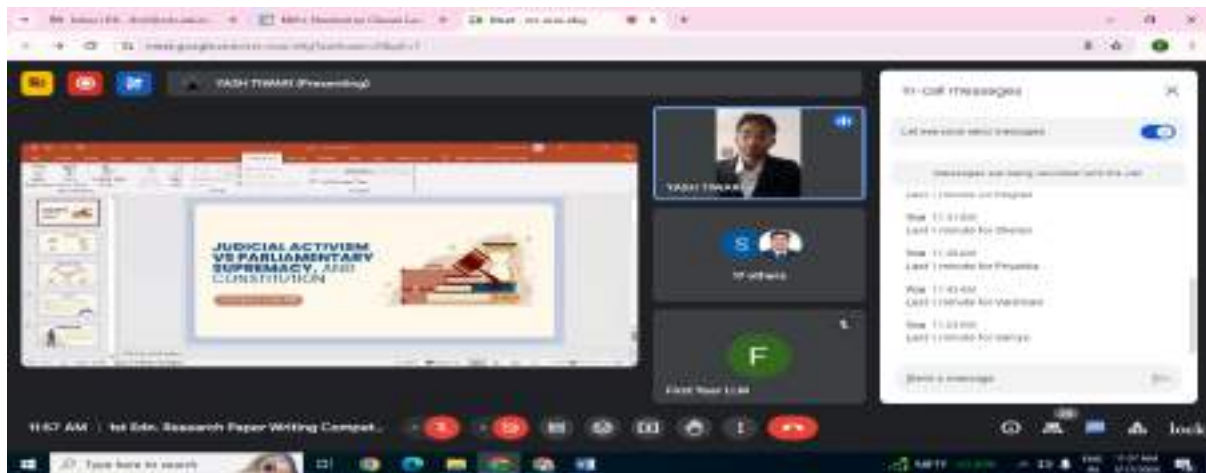

Overview of the event:

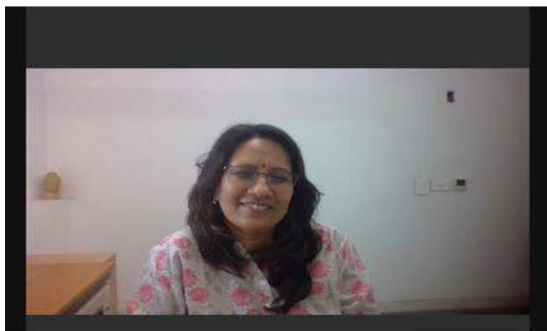
