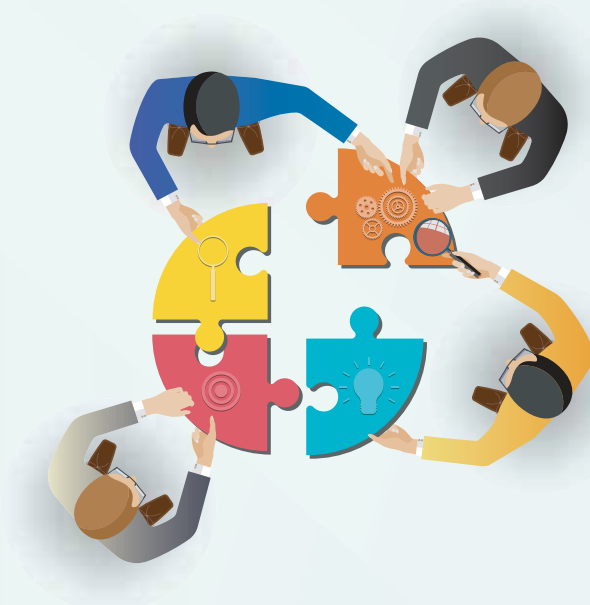
Our Team

Code of Conduct for Students

1. The College believes in promoting a safe and congenial environment, which it does so by enforcing behavioural standards. All students must uphold academic integrity, respect everyone around, their rights, belongings, safety of others, etc.
2. A student is expected to maintain 75% attendance per semester. In case a student falls short of attendance, disciplinary action is initiated against such a student.
3. Students must note that official works like; examination form, issue of marks statement, revaluation work, etc. all are done through the guidelines of SPPU. Students should strictly follow the schedule given by the University communicated by the College from time to time. College authorities are not responsible in case students fail to do any of such works in the given time schedule.
4. Use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited during classroom sessions. In case, any student is found using a mobile phone in the teaching session, his/her mobile phone is confiscated immediately and the student has to face disciplinary action.
5. College uniform is compulsory for all the students. They are required to be in College uniform as prescribed by the Disciplinary Committee of the College. Directions regarding College uniform are given by the Chairperson of Disciplinary Committee and concerned class teachers from time to time.

How to file a Complaint?

- On receipt of an online complaint, the College shall refer the complaint to the Student Grievance Redressal Committee.
- On receipt of the complaint, the Committee shall conduct inquiry and submit the report with recommendations to the Head of the College and a copy thereof to aggrieved student within 15 days from the date of receipt of the complaint.
- An aggrieved student, if not satisfied with the decision of the committee, may make an appeal to the Principal (Appellate Authority) within 10 days from the date of decision of the committee to seek a relief.

Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)

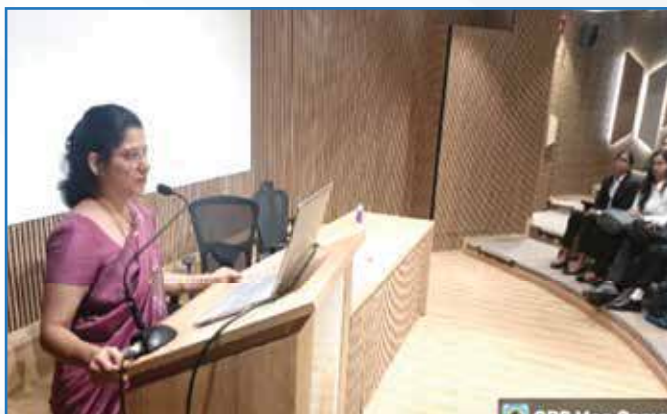
Induction Programme

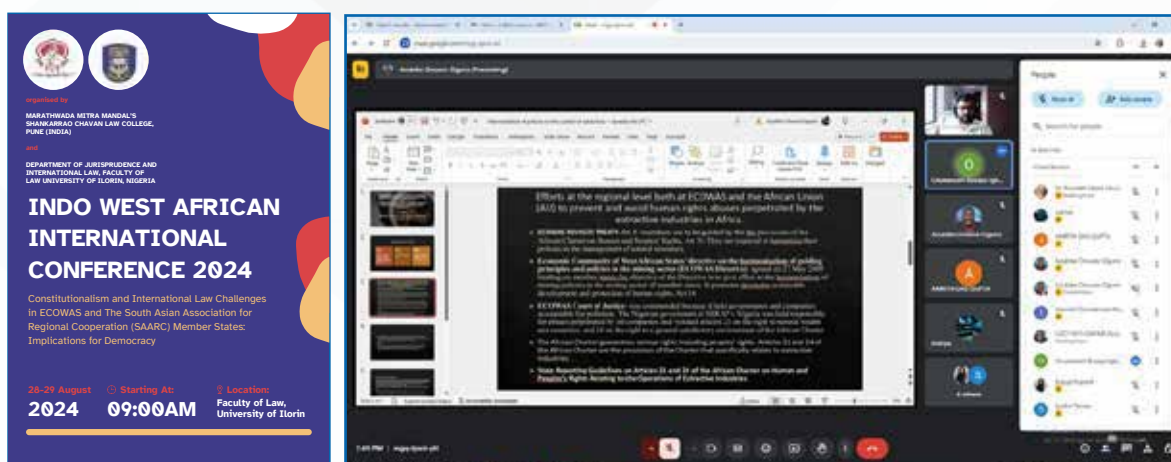
Constitutionalism and International Law Challenges in ECOWAS and SAARC Member States: Implications for Democracy **28th- 29th Aug., 2024**

The Consumer Protection Act, 2019: Issues and Challenges **17th Aug., 2024**

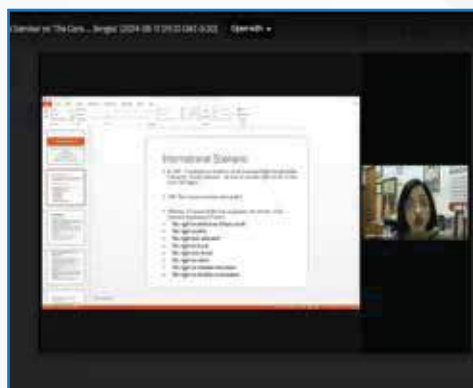

Understanding the Three New Criminal Laws: Adapting to Legal Transformation 20th July 2024

A One-Day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) was organised by the College to provide an overview of the three newly introduced Criminal Laws in India, namely; Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam (BSA). It was organised to help the teaching faculty adapt to the (new) legal transformations and enhance their pedagogical approaches. It was coordinated by Dr. Sudhir Tarote, faculty of law.

Adv. Milind Datrange, APP, conducted the first Session on the topic, *From IPC to Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita: Rationale Behind the Transition*. He discussed the historical context and the need for updating the IPC, and explained the key changes and improvements introduced in the BNS.

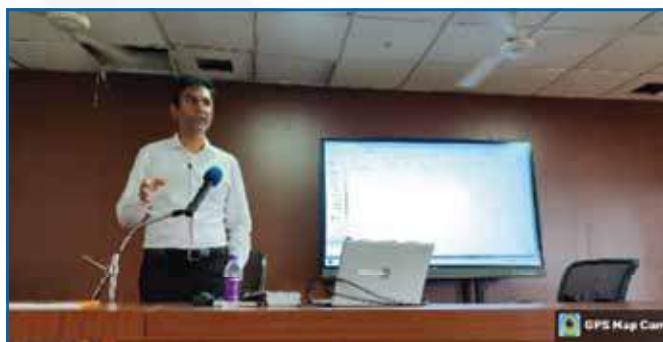
The second Session was conducted by Adv. Vaibhav Salunkhe on the topic, *Electronic Evidence in Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam: Admissibility and Safeguards*. Detailed provisions related to electronic evidence under the BSA were discussed by him emphasising on the criteria for admissibility, and the necessary safeguards to ensure the integrity of electronic evidence.

Shri. Ganesh Shirsat, a renowned academician, conducted the third Session on the topic, *Teaching Pedagogy for New Criminal Laws*. He shared innovative teaching methodologies to effectively teach the new laws to students by suggesting practical tips on incorporating case studies, moot courts, and role plays into the curriculum. He explored the new initiatives introduced under BNSS and their impact on public safety and security along with the procedural changes focusing on protecting citizens' rights.

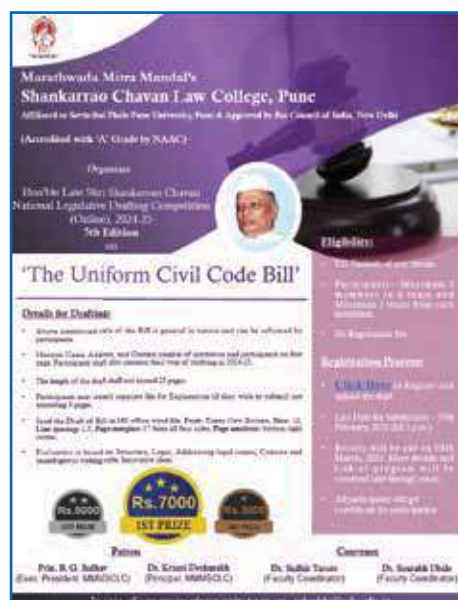

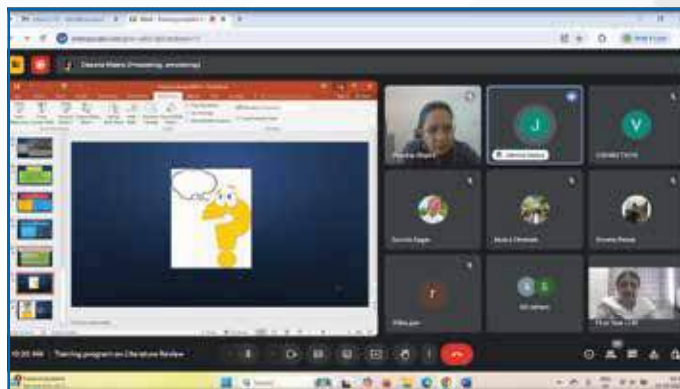


Training Program on Research Methodology

Day 2: Non-Doctrinal Research (Tools and Sampling Techniques)

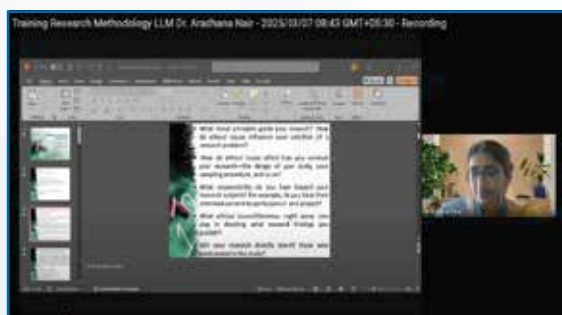

Arbitration - Law and Practice **1st Oct. - 15th Nov., 2024**

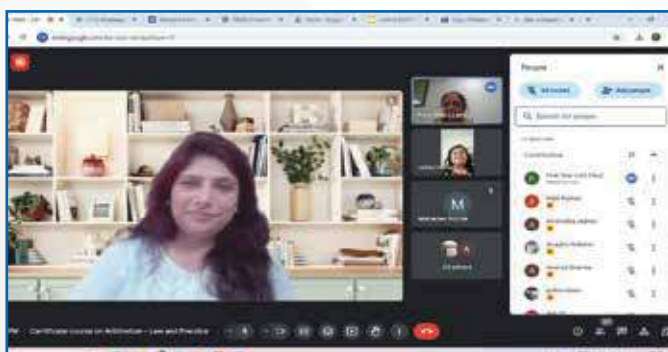

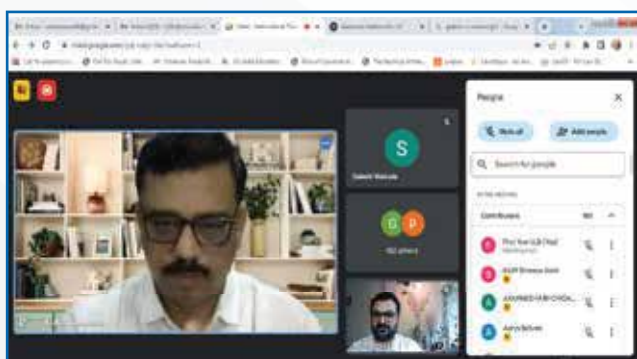

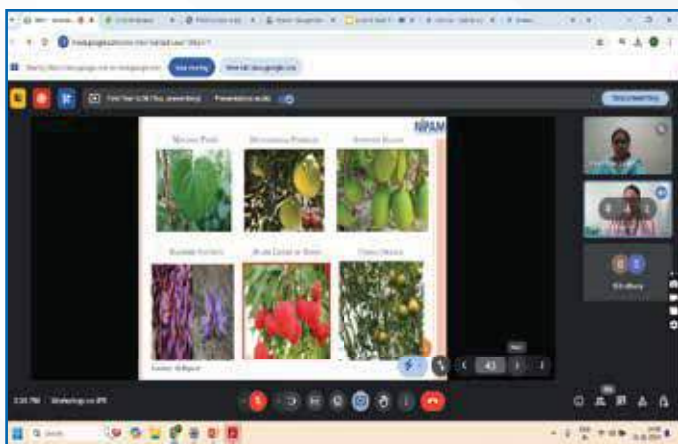
One Day Workshop

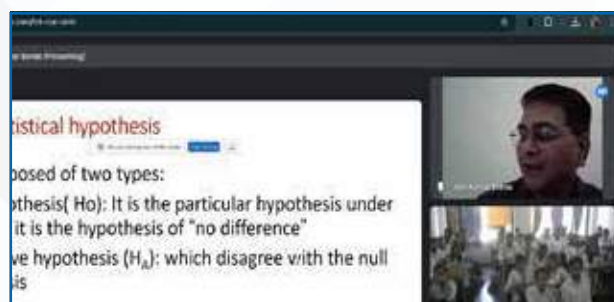
